WHY'S SHE ALWAYS POURING WATER?

A sacrament is an outward and visible sign of inward and spiritual divine grace. As Presbyterians, we have two sacraments – Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The baptismal font is filled on Sunday morning as an outward sign of God's grace in Christ: the grace we receive as disciples of Christ and the grace that binds us together as Christ's Church. As the water is poured, you are invited to reflect on Christianity's rich interpretation of the mystery of this sacrament:

- the faithfulness of God
- the washing away of sin
- rebirth
- putting on the fresh garment of Christ
- being sealed by God's spirit
- adoption into the covenant family of Christ
- resurrection and illumination of Christ

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on January 12th, we will remember our own baptism. We are baptized only once, but we spend a lifetime learning to live into the gift of new life we receive at the font and receiving the bread of life at Christ's table. As the water is poured, the bread broken and the cup filled, remember that you have been claimed – and we together have been claimed – as Christ's own forever.

Remember your baptism!!

Session Highlights

The following are some highlights from the November and December meetings:

- Approved a Child Protection Policy, including screening for staff and persons volunteering with children and youth.
- Approved contracting with Holy Cow! consultant to present survey results to congregation.
- Approved transferring \$90,000 of the \$138,000 current balance of the McCullough Distribution Fund as follows:
 - 55,000 source to balance the 2020 Operating Budget;
 - 25,000 to restore the Emergency Repairs Fund;
 - \$10,000 donation to the Blackhawk Presbytery Mission Grant Program.
- Approved making some benefits available to staff through the Board of Pensions.
- Explored options for future Confirmation programming.
- Began background checks with Protect My Ministry for staff and volunteers w/children.

November net operating income was unfavorable at (\$6,587) bringing the YTD net operating income still favorable by about \$10,100. The projection for net operating income at Year-End is estimated to remain favorable by \$5,000 vs. the Annual Budget (2nd Qtr. Review) unfavorable of about (\$18,000).

Balance Sheet – no significant changes for the month. Cash Flow – no significant issues.

2020 Operating Budget – As mentioned last month, next year’s budget continues to be a challenge by almost \$60,000 based upon pledges received to date and other anticipated income for 2020. It appears that the 2020 Operating Budget, unfortunately, will be balanced by again drawing upon a McCullough funded account. Fortunately, God has blessed us by providing McCullough funds to supplement normal income to fund the operations of our church. More detail will be shared with the congregation at the Annual Meeting.
