## Lectionary Bible Study—Wednesdays at 7:30 a.m.



Our goal for this offering is \$1365 and will be collected between September 5 and October 3, 2021. We will report on progress toward our goal every couple of weeks during worship service.


The Deacons will be assisting the hospitality committee with the Advent bags again this year.

Happy Birthday to Us! - 175 Years of FPC in Woodstock

This month, let’s look back at our education history!

Sunday school, confirmation, and vacation Bible school have been hallmarks for the children.

Sunday school staffing seems to have been a challenge even in the early 1980s. In a 1980 talk, eighth-grader Greg Bradshaw said, “One thing that bothers me ... is, every year, the church almost has to beg teachers to teach in the Sunday school program. When the kids hear this, they don’t feel it’s really important to go to Sunday school, if they can’t find teachers.” He went on to say that Sunday school taught him to pray and read the Bible and gave him the opportunity to sing and discuss problems. Volunteers creatively led the children’s Sunday school through 2016. Then, a part-time youth coordinator position was created. Adult education has taken many forms: Bible and book studies, women’s retreats, spiritual gifts and other seminars, and small group discussions.



**Clerk's Report:** Sue Krause was approved as Nominating Committee chair.

**Pastor's Report:** Session received with thanks Pastor Cindy Carlisle final report

**Memorial Committee:** A motion was approved to provide \$1,100 to the

N.O.W. Team for new metal prep tables, associated accessories and a knife set.

**Nominating Committee:** A recommendation to appoint Erin Kaye to the Worship Committee was approved.

**COVID Task Force:** Session authorized Building and Grounds to purchase and install a plexiglass shield for the pulpit, and Worship, Music and Arts to establish two children's tables at the rear of the sanctuary.

**Ministry Support – Building and Grounds:** B&G reported that an anonymous donor funded the painting project.

**Ministry Support – Personnel:** Recruiting for a permanent accompanist is underway with job postings on our website, and solicitation by Christy Johanson. Danik Koostra has been secured as interim accompanist.

**Worship, Music and Arts:** A post-worship celebration for Bob Diss, including a card shower, has been planned for his final Sunday with us.

**Compassion, Peace and Justice:** A committee recommendation to use \$250 from the Tamaeus Fund for Girls for Ghana was approved. The committee asked Session to review at the September meeting which restricted funds are to be managed by the Memorial Committee and which might still be managed by individual committees. Session will conduct this review at the September meeting.

**Congregational Life:** The N.O.W. team is looking at options to handle setup and takedown of tables and chairs, since the new cleaning service will not be providing these services.

**Next Regular Meeting:** Sunday, September 19, 2021 at 11:00 p.m. in person.

McCullough Endowment Fund Performance Commentary:

The Portfolio ended 2nd Quarter at \$1,061,958 vs. previous quarter end value of \$1,020,023 and a withdrawal of \$10,576.

2nd Quarter 2021 Performance was +5.16%% vs. +5.23% for the blended index used to compare performance.

One -year return at 6/30/21 was 24.5% and in line with a blended index.
